1. The Mái Nhà foundation

The Mái Nhà foundation was founded in 2010 and registered at the Chamber of Commerce with registration number 50044990. On the 2nd of august 2010 the Dutch Tax authorities granted the ANBI status to the Mái Nhà foundation. The RSIN number of the foundation is 822514096.

The objective of the Mái Nhà foundation is to financially assist the establishment of orphanages as well as shelters and support for children and their parents in need of help.

2. The board of the Mái Nhà foundation

The board of the Mái Nhà foundation consists of:
Bart Bendel (president)
John Regout (secretary)
Pieter Peletier (treasurer)
Robert Jongstra (communications)
The board does not receive any remuneration from the foundation

The foundation has supported Mái Nhà in 2019 through:

- Fund raising activities: the foundation has received € 134.340.- in donations in 2019. € 100.000,- of these donations (from one party) were earmarked for a new English school project.
- Advisory function. In 2019 one boardmeeting with the management of Mái Nhà was held and various conference calls and in person meetings took place. According to the bylaws of Stichting Mai Nha, the Board would have to convene every 4 months. The Board unanimously has waived this article 5.3 for the years 2019 and 2020.
- Development of promotional programs like newsletters and presentations.

3. Relationship with the Vietnamese SRE Mái Nhà

The Mái Nhà foundation in the Netherlands was founded to support the Vietnamese SRE (Social Relief Establishment) Mái Nhà. Mái Nhà Children Foundation Vietnam was established as a "Social Relief Establishment" (*Vietnamese: Co so nuoi duong tre mo coi Mai Nha*) in Vietnam and is located in Thien Nghiep in Vietnam, 220 km east of Saigon close to the city of Phan Thiet. The SRE Mái Nhà Vietnam aims to improve the lives of underprivileged children. This is done through:

- An orphanage with a capacity of 16 children, handicapped or not of 0-6 years old when admitted to the orphanage.
- A scholarship program for 100 children in the region of Thien Nghiep.
- Multi-functional support for less privileged families in Thien Nghiep
- Schooling infrastructure

The essence of the relationship between the two entities is laid down in a covenant, which commits the Mái Nhà foundation to cover up to a maximum of 50%, as far as money is available, of the budgeted and approved annual expenses of the SRE Mái Nhà Vietnam, irrespective of funds raised by other similar support organizations in France, the USA, Vietnam or elsewhere. In addition, other projects may be sponsored on an ad hoc basis. In 2019 the Mái Nhà foundation has committed € 100.000,- for an English School Project in Thien Nghiep. A similar amount has been committed in 2017.

The Board of the foundation has approved the budgets for 2019 as well as the annual report 2018 as presented by the management of the Vietnamese SRE. A financial report of the Vietnamese SRE is available on request

10. Multi annual commitments

In 2019 27 individuals committed to donations with a total annual value of € 30.190 to the Mái Nhà foundation. Of this amount, € 20.490 has been received in 2019. The balance of € 9.600 is expected to be received in 2020.

Future annual commitments covering the period 2020 and 2021 amount up to € 13:840.

11. Future

The SRE Mái Nhà Vietnam is well established in the Thien Nghiep region in Vietnam by now. Still, the need for support of underprivileged children remains high. The board of the Mái Nhà foundation foresees also for the coming years all it's efforts and funds raised will be directed towards supporting the SRE Mái Nhà Vietnam and the new English School.
