Would you believe that our 16 children are now mostly teenagers?

Many of them came to Mai Nha the day they were born. Now, our eldest Tuyen is 16. The youngest in the family will always be our baby, but little Duong is not so little anymore! She turned 10 this year. Indeed how time flies. It's a striking change but we couldn't be prouder to see each of our children grow into such unique individuals.

They are developing strong characters, each with his or her own nuanced personality and different areas of interest. This also means that our local staff is adjusting to the changing needs of our teens and pre-teens. They are taking into account the children's particularities, from varying emotional needs, to schooling needs. Different kids will need different ways of coaching, motivating and guidance. The intent is to support them in honing good foundations to grow into disciplined, mature and well-balanced adults.

a family where everyone contributes

The children take pride in their responsibilities. Without exception, they all take care of cleaning their bedrooms and they all help out in the daily chores. They've also grown closer through shared activities like sports and sharing hobbies like reading and watching TV. As much as able, screen time is regulated in the home. It's good that the kids have developed a love for outdoor activities as well.

In fact, last summer, all the kids were enrolled in swimming lessons. Not only is it an important life skill, it built their confidence and they all just loved the experience!

Part of growing up is making friends and we're happy to share that all the children have been showing healthy social skills. At school, they enjoy playing with their friends and these friends are invited to Mai Nha for special occasions like birthdays.

looking up to each other

One of the most important values instilled in the children is that they are to look after one another. They are brothers and sisters in the Mai Nha home.

But beyond that, we're happy to see that the older kids are becoming good role models for the younger ones.

Our eldest Tuyen is now in second year High School. We're proud to underline her extremely positive attitude as our first teenager. She does her best in school and follows safety rules when it is outside her Mai Nha home. She is clearly a perfect example to her 15 siblings.

Our girl An started middle school this year. She is such a strong young lady doing her best to overcome her handicap both physically and in subjects like math. She clearly loves the arts. Thanks to the multiple hand surgeries she braved through, she is now able to fully express her artistic talents. She told us before that her dream is to be an art teacher! She is definitely on her way to achieving that dream and inspiring the whole family.

(update on the Mai Nha support system)

it takes a village

Raising a child is no easy feat. Raising 16 kids in one family is all the more an endeavor.

But we are so blessed to have such dedicated local staff and support system, including volunteers.

To support the children in their schooling, a highly effective system has been implemented.

- 5 days a week, all children benefit from highly committed tutors who come on site for one-on-ones and homework help.
- On weekends, an English teacher comes to Mai Nha. We have noticed great progress in the children's communication skills and the interaction between the children and the teacher has been very positive.

This system has been very valuable especially since only 2 children are in primary school and 13 are already in middle school.

On top of the local staff who is taking care of the children on a full time basis since the very first day they were welcomed at Mai Nha, our psychologists Mrs. Hoa and Mrs. Lam continue to visit the children regularly. They provide highly professional support with love and sincere care.

mai Nha scholars

This year, Mai Nha has decided to support 54 students of the Thien Nghiep community including 14 university students. The selection process has been optimized to ensure that the qualification process is fair and that deserving students get the right support.



Mai Nha's scholarship program started 12 years ago. The cooperation with the local authorities in this process has been excellent as well. It is notably a tangible solution to optimizing the schooling potential of the children of Thien Nghiep regardless of the financial capabilities of their parents or families.



mentoring programs

We have always advocated that education is more than just enrolling children in a school. Empowering them with the support they need to thrive is as important as opening the opportunity for them to study.

Our one-on-one mentoring program for Saigon-based university scholars has been further expanded. We successfully mounted two gatherings of our alumni. All of them expressed gratitude towards Mai Nha for enabling them to pursue formal education that helps them find jobs and support themselves and their families. More than saying thanks, many expressed the desire to give back, offering their time and talents to mentor the next generation of Mai Nha scholars.

With such positive momentum, plans are on the way to creating a Mai Nha Alumni Club. This would make mentorship a sustainable cycle. It not only helps the young scholars, it also brings out the teacher in our graduates and makes for a fulfilling, full circle experience.
